Our planet's, and people's, health depends on clean water. Because Newark storm drains empty into the Passaic River, Newark's rainwater travels out to the Atlantic Ocean where it evaporates and is recycled into rain.

Chemicals from lawns, roadways and buildings are washed into storm drains (or directly into natural water bodies). Let's start a dialogue about how to capture stormwater and put it to good use.

Permeable pavements, rain gardens, roof gardens, community gardens, rain barrels and cisterns are solutions that are easy to implement and can transform our world starting with the City of Newark.
